Susanna Self is currently a flutist and piccoloist with the West Texas Symphony, Principal Flutist with Peninsula Music Festival, and was a Flute Instructor at Interlochen Arts Camp this past summer. She has also taught at Texas Tech University, Eastern New Mexico University, and Maryville University, and was a certified music therapist from 2010-2020. Before moving to Lubbock Texas, she was Acting Assistant Principal in the Saint Louis Symphony, Assistant Principal and Second Flutist with the Baltimore Symphony, and Principal Flutist with the Charlotte Symphony. She lives in Lubbock, Texas with her husband, cellist Jeffrey Noel Lastrapes, and her two dogs, Joey and Lily.

KATE BOYD

Dr. Kate Boyd, serves as Professor of Piano and piano area coordinator at Butler University. She has performed as a soloist and as a chamber music partner throughout the United States and beyond. Boyd has presented lectures and workshops at state, regional, national, and international conferences, including the 2023 MTNA National Conference in Reno; the International John Cage Conference in Malaysia; the EPTA Conference in Germany; the CMS Great Lakes Regional Conference; and various state conferences. She was named IMTA Teacher of the Year

in 2019 and received Butler University's Outstanding Professor of the Year award in 2017. For 11 years Dr. Boyd was on the faculty of Interlochen Arts Camp in northern Michigan; for four of those years, she served as piano area coordinator.
