ABOUT THE ARTISTS

BUTLER UNIVERSITY JAZZ ENSEMBLE

The award-winning Butler University Jazz Ensemble is one of eight jazz-related ensembles at Butler University. Under the direction of Dr. Matt Pivec, the band has performed with world-renowned guest artists such as Kenny Barron, Cécile McLorin-Salvant, Sullivan Fortner, John Clayton, Benny Golson, Wycliffe Gordon, Stefon Harris, Maria Schneider, Kurt Elling, Christian McBride, Bobby Sanabria, Donny McCaslin, Fred Sturm, Robert Baca, Melvin Rhyne, Steve Allee, Ted Poor, and the Wee Trio.

In the past decade, the Butler University Jazz Ensemble has been selected to perform at several prestigious conferences including the 2023 Midwest Clinic International Band and Orchestra Conference in Chicago and the 2024 Western International Band Clinic in Seattle. The ensemble has also performed at the Indiana Music Educators Association state conference in 2023, 2020, and 2014.

The Butler University Jazz Ensemble has been the recipient of many awards, including being honored as the winner of the Downbeat Student Music Awards Undergraduate Large Ensemble Category in 2020 and 2024.

In addition to performing a variety of regular on-campus concerts, the ensemble has performed at professional venues such as the Jazz Kitchen, Indy Jazz Fest, and Jazz at the Bistro. Since 2008, the ensemble has toured to New Orleans, Memphis, Chicago, and St. Louis.

Butler University Jazz is very active in educational and outreach programs including the Benny Golson Jazz Festival, the Butler Youth Jazz Program, and the Butler Summer Jazz Camp.

MARK BUSELLI

Mark Buselli has over fifty arrangements published for big bands, brass ensemble, and piano/trumpet. He has ten recordings out as a leader on the Owl Studios and OA2 record labels. He has performed with many notable artists and has played for four United States presidents.

Mark was the featured trumpet soloist on the award-winning short film "Claire and the Keys" released in 2015. He was a semi-finalist judge for the 2017 Essentially Ellington competition held at Lincoln Center in NYC and has served as a finalist for the National Jazz Trumpet Competition.

As Director of Jazz Studies at Ball State University, Mark has taken his college bands on tours of Russia, China, Germany, Italy, France, Poland, Switzerland, and the Czech Republic.

Mark Buselli currently serves as Education Director of the Buselli/Wallarab Jazz Orchestra in Indianapolis, where he has created numerous educational opportunities for over 50 thousand students with their relationship to Arts For Learning of Indiana.

Mr. Buselli graduated from the Berklee School of Music in Boston and received his MM in Jazz Studies from Indiana University. While at Indiana he was awarded a Performers Certificate. The late David Baker personally picked the Buselli/Wallarab Jazz Orchestra to record his music.

He is a Yamaha performing artist and the Director of the Jazz track for the Music For All Summer Symposium. Mark resides in Indianapolis with his wife Andrea and daughter Sophia.
